E02 v1.2 | Carbon Pricing

As the peak national body for facilities management, FMA Australia supports evidence-based measures and initiatives to reduce pollution and waste in all forms, including greenhouse gas emissions.

As an incentive to reduce pollution, support innovation and provide market certainty, FMA Australia supports market-based mechanisms that place a value on greenhouse gas emissions which better reflects total economic, environmental and social costs.

In implementing such schemes, Governments should allocate funding to support and invest in the wider built environment sector with complimentary measures around mitigation, adaptation and educational activities.

Such measures must only be implemented through industry collaboration and with full understanding of the expertise required for facilities management to successfully ensure the health, wellbeing and productivity of the Australian community.
